

# Introducing the Inaugural CEO and Technical Committee

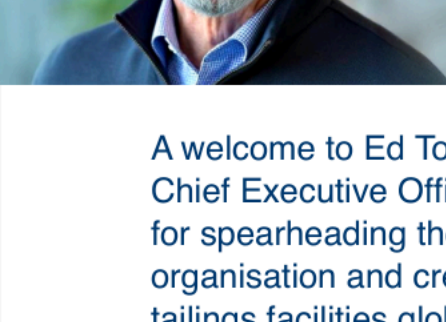
**New appointments to drive the scale up of the Institute, including implementing an audit and certification process for tailings safety.**

Last week marked seven years since the Brumadinho tailings dam collapse, which claimed 272 lives. The anniversary is always a stark reminder of the devastating consequences of tailings facility failures. Thoughts remain with everyone who lost loved ones or were impacted by this tragedy.

That day—25 January 2019—was a turning point for the industry and the start of a vital journey to make tailings facilities safer for people and the environment. The Global Tailings Management Institute (GTMI) was established to oversee the implementation of, and conformance with, the Global Industry Standard on Tailing Management, and help prevent such a tragedy from happening again.

Today, two crucial milestones in driving the Institute's work forward have been reached with the appointment of the GTMI's [Chief Executive Officer](#) and [Technical Committee](#).

## Welcoming the GTMI Technical Committee

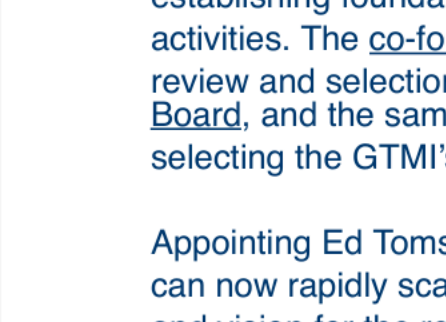
Another significant development is the formation of the first GTMI Technical Committee, which will oversee all technical matters related to the audit and certification process, including accreditation and training programmes.

## Auditors, Signatories and Supporters

**Signatories** are mining companies or government owned enterprises that have an operational responsibility for tailings facilities. They will commit to:

- Implementing and conforming with the GISTM
- Undergoing independent auditing and certification
- Continuously improving their tailings management practices
- Publicly disclosing information about their facilities and auditing outcomes.
